Instructions:

1. Cut as indicated to make a square.
 2. Fold to make two diagonal lines across the square and then leave open.
 3. Fold in each of the four corners to the center.
 4. Turn the paper over.
 5. Fold these four corners into the square.
 6. There is a half size square with four (actually eight) triangles, which meet in the center.
 7. Turn the paper over. Four squares meet in the center.
 8. Fold the paper in half and unfold.
 9. Stick fingers under the flaps, and push the square into a formation like this:
